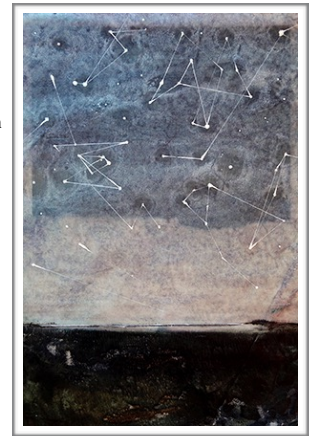
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Encaustic Monotype: Molten Painterly Prints with Catherine Nash

DATES: Thu, Jun 23rd - Sun, Jun 26th 2016

TIME: 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

Create translucent images utilizing the innovative and new techniques of encaustic monotype. Enhance your prints by experimenting with the use of stencils and masks, subtractive and additive mark-making techniques as well as the ability to enrich the surface with mixed media drawing, wax collage and encaustic painting. Melted, pigmented waxes on a hot plate can be transferred to a variety of papers both Western and Japanese to build "washes" and visual textures. Layer color to achieve rich nuances of tone and depth. During this in-depth, four-day investigation, you'll explore how the variables of heat, paint, paper and pressure can affect your printmaking results and keep a notebook with samples of your conclusions as a reference for the future. No prior experience required.

We will explore different materials to be cut and cover specific techniques and methods for papercutting and demonstrate stenciling. During this intensive class of serious fun, participants will discover the incredible variety of the contemporary papercutting scene and the many possible applications of this art form to other domains. Learn stenciling, dimensional techniques and animation possibilities.

It is relatively easy to make a drawing or a painting look like it was a cloudy day or soft, subdued light, but are you able to capture the correct values of strong direct light? Gain expertise in reproducing light and shadow in its true contrasts of a sunny day. Acquire more confidence in capturing accurate values that create the illusion of 3D form while using a variety of media (black and white opening a discussion of color). We will explore nature, plants and the landscape through a directed series of drawing and water based painting exercises, that will increase an ability to see and render varied qualities of light, from direct sunlight to more subtle contrasts of light and shadow. For artists of all skill levels who love to paint or draw.

PHOTOSHOP ELEMENTS 14 QUICKSTART

This simplified, beginner friendly class is designed to get you off to a solid start with Adobe Photoshop Elements. We will concentrate on the most important Photoshop tools you need to know about in order to quickly improve your photographs. Learn just eight simple steps for making fundamental image corrections and properly prepare your photographs for emailing or printing. You will find out how to “rescue” a bad shot, set the resolution of an image, remove color tints and red eye, fix blemishes, improve photos that are too dark or too light and find out how to make your photos really “pop.” Bring your laptop and follow along, or watch the projected demonstrations, take notes and use the handouts back at home on your computer.

Whether you are a photographer using a digital camera, or a painter who takes digital photos for reference or for documenting your paintings, knowing what to do with your digital images *after* taking the shot is essential. Learn to use Adobe Photoshop Elements 12- a low cost yet powerful tool for basic digital image processing. Beginners will learn easy ways to correctly size images for either printing or emailing, remove color tints, use layers, select parts of one image to add to another (great for making reference photos to paint from), retouch, get rid of red eye, add text and find out how to “rescue” a poorly exposed photograph. Wish you hadn’t taken the family reunion photograph with that telephone pole sticking out of the top of your kid’s head? It’s an easy fix in Photoshop! If you are ready to take the next step with your digital photographs this “beginner friendly” class is for you.

Learn to use a simple “kitchen table” set up to photograph small objects and still life arrangements. Artists - become more proficient at taking your own reference photos of botanical specimens, shells, skeletal structures etc. Photographers- if you can't always get out into the field for your photography you can do really interesting work right at home by arranging still life set up's and photographing them- it's an art form in itself. This is a beginning level class with no experience necessary. We will start with an overview of basic camera function and review the pros and cons of different cameras and lenses. We will use simple set up's that you can duplicate at home at little or no cost. Please bring to class whatever camera you have. If you have a tripod you can bring that too. You are welcome to bring small objects you are interested in photographing or simply choose from the many natural objects the museum will provide for you such as plants, skulls, feathers, and dried saguaro blossoms.
